- Objectives : This course aims at developing an intermediate level of Japanese conversation skills (listening and speaking) on various situations that learners might encounter on campus and daily life. Taking this course, students will be able to carry out the conversation in more natural way, through mainly role play activities.
- Prerequisite : Completion of Intermediate1 Speaking course or JLPT N3 equivalent, CEFR B1 equivalent
- Textbook : Shinpan Chuukyuu kara Jookyuu eno Nihongo Kaiwa (Bonjinsha)
- Evaluation : Midterm Exam 30%, Final Exam 30%, Final Presentation 10%, Assignments 15%, Short Speech 5%, Classroom Activity 10%.
 • Course completion requires fulfillment of all the following conditions:
 1) Attendance of more than 70% of scheduled classes; 2) Completion of the final exam; 3) A final grade higher than a C.
 • Letter grades for the entire course will be assigned as follows:
 A:100-80% B:79-65% C:64-50% F:49-0%
 • Makeup exams for midterm and final exams can be scheduled ONLY within one week after regular exams. Makeup exams will only be worth 80% of the possible score that can be attained through regular exams. No makeup will be offered for other quizzes.
