- Objectives : The aim of this course is to enable international students and Japanese students to experience each other's cultures and societies through collaborative learning. In class, students are invited to discuss various topics surrounding daily life with the main keywords "multicultural", intercultural" and "mutual understanding". The results of these activities will be presented in the form of presentations and reports. We are also planning to visit a primary school(小学校 shoogakkoo)in Japan as part of our contribution to the local community.
- Prerequisite : • Completion of one of the following Integral course (Intermediate 2, 3, Advanced 1) or JLPT N2/N1 equivalent, CEFR B2/B2+/C1 equivalent.

- Evaluation : Class activities 20% Mid-tern Exam 20%,Presentation 40%, Final Exam 20%.
1. Course will be completed if all the following requirements have been met:1) Have attended more than 70% of classes 2) Have completed final exam 3) A final grade higher than a C.
2. Letter grades for the entire course will be assigned as follows: A:80-100% B:65-79% C:50-64% F:0-49%
3. Makeup exams for mid-term and final exams can be scheduled ONLY in the one week period after the exam date. Makeup exams will only be worth 80% of the possible score that can be attained through regular exams.
