- Objectives : This course aims to develop Japanese proficiency to understand a wide range of topics, from everyday issues to social challenges, and connect deeper with society. Using real-world materials, students strengthen their advanced-level proficiency in the four language skills through activities such as video viewing, readings, and presentations. In collaborative learning settings, including group discussions, students deepen their understanding through dialogue and cultivate the ability to express themselves logically and appropriately.
- Prerequisite : Completion of Intermediate Integral course or JLPT N1 equivalent, CEFR B2+ equivalent
- Textbook : Original Materials
- Evaluation : Class Participation 10%, Listening Assignments 12%, Reading Assignments 12%, Writing Assignments 6%, Presentations 10%, Midterm Exam 25%, Final Exam 25%
- Course completion requires fulfillment of all the following conditions:
    - 1) Attendance of more than 70% of scheduled classes
    - 2) Completion of the final exam
    - 3) A final grade higher than a C.
  - Letter grades for the entire course will be assigned as follows:  
A:100-80% B:79-65% C:64-50% F:49-0%
  - Make-up exams for midterm and final exams can be scheduled ONLY within one week after regular exams. Makeup exams will only be worth 80% of the possible score that can be attained through regular exams. No makeup will be offered for other quizzes.
